

ORDINANCE NO. 72

An Ordinance regulating traffic on the Highways of the Borough of Clymer and providing penalty for violation thereof.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Borough of Clymer and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same.

Section 1. Franklin Street, Sixth Street and Penn Street are hereby designed as main travelled roads or through highway and shall be marked by erecting at the entrances signs bearing the words, "THRU TRAFFIC STOP" in letters at least six inches in height, notifying drivers of vehicles to come to a full stop before entering or crossing such designated highways; all such signs shall be illuminated at night or so placed as to be illuminated by headlights of approaching vehicles or by street lights.

Section 2. The Police Officers of the Borough may further regulate traffic on all highways of the Borough by signs and other devices and by markings on the highways showing places and the manner in which vehicles may be parked, subject to such modifications as Council shall make.

Section 3. No vehicle shall be parked within fifteen feet of a fire hydrant or within twenty-five feet of any crossing.

Section 4. When traffic signals are in operation, vehicles shall stop on red and go on green.

Section 5. Motor vehicles while standing upon the highways of the Borough shall have lights as required by law except when within one hundred feet of an arc light.

Section 6. Any person upon conviction of violating of any regulation authorized by this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00 for each offence and in default of payment of said fine and the costs may be sentenced and committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding 10 days.
