

ORDINANCE NO. 9

An Ordinance prohibiting and regulating the running at large of dogs and fixing the penalties for violation of this ordinance.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, in the County of Indiana, and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. No bitch, while in heat, shall be permitted to run at large; any person violating the provision of this section shall pay a fine or penalty of not less than two or more than ten dollars.

Section 2. No dog afflicted with rabies or any disease, shall be permitted to run at large. No dog bitten by another dog having rabies or any similar disease, or which there is reason to believe was lately bitten by another dog having rabies or any similar disease, (to be determined by Chief Burgess upon facts presented) shall be permitted to run at large. Any dog or bitch found running at large, contrary to the provisions of this section, is hereby declared to be a public nuisance, and the High Constable, Police or such person as the Chief Burgess or Council may appoint for that purpose, shall kill and remove the same, and shall receive from the Borough a fee of one dollar for killing, removing and burying each dog.
