

ORDINANCE NO. 99

An ordinance regulating traffic on certain streets and highways running through the Borough of Clymer and providing a penalty for violation thereof.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Borough of Clymer, in council assembled, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same.

Section 1. No vehicle shall proceed at an excessive rate of speed upon any street of the Borough and at no time shall a vehicle be driven recklessly and in negligent disregard of the conditions then obtaining and of the rights of others.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than five (\$5.00) dollars nor more than fifty (\$50.00) dollars for each offense, and in default of payment of said fine and costs may be sentenced and committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding ten (ten) days.

Section 3. Any ordinance or part of Ordinances conflicting with this Ordinance is hereby repealed in so far as the same affects this Ordinance.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough of Clymer that in accordance with the Acts of Assembly relating to Police Pension Contracts and the allocation of funds under Act No. 72, April 6, 1945, P.L. 160 and any Acts amendatory thereto or pertinent to the subject matter, the Borough hereby expresses its intention to enter into a contract with the Fidelity Mutual Life Insurance Company and authorizes the Secretary to make application for a Retirement Annuity Contract or a contract of insurance on the Retirement Income plan of the lives of:

D. W. Lyle, Chief of Police and Lloyd Barger, Patrolman

policemen employed by the Borough of Clymer in order to provide pension or retirement benefits for each policemen or the dependents of such policemen. That ownership of said contract shall be vested in said Borough; that a death benefit shall be payable to the dependents of such policeman; that upon issuance, said contract shall be delivered to the secretary of the Borough to be held for the said policeman; that the proper officers of said Borough are hereby authorized and directed to pay all premiums on said contract as they deem advisable in accordance with the terms thereof in the same form and manner as payments that are made for other lawful expenditures; and the Borough is authorized to exercise all options, rights and privileges provided in said contract or which The Fidelity Mutual Life Insurance Company may consent to grant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the procedure hereinbefore set forth expressing the intent to purchase the Annuity Contract and make application therefor, on the lives of the same or other policemen of the Borough from time to time and from year to year, may be carried into effect, with the necessary and desired factual changes, without the necessity of the formalities adopted in the original Resolution therefor, the intent being to thus facilitate the procedure.
