

ORDINANCE NO. 100

An Ordinance regulating the removal, haulage and disposal of garbage and rubbish in the Borough of Clymer.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Clymer, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, either as principal or agent, to haul or cause to be hauled for hire any garbage or rubbish over any street in the Borough without obtaining the consent of Council.

Section 2. No house refuse, offal, garbage, ashes, dead animals, decaying vegetable matter or organic waste substance of any kind shall be thrown on any street, ditch, gutter or public place or private lot within the limits of this Borough.

Section 3. The exclusive privilege of collecting garbage and rubbish in the Borough shall be granted to such person as Council shall appoint and for such length of time as Council shall designate.

Section 4. The person appointed under the provisions of Section 3 shall provide a vehicle having a receptacle covered so as to prevent the escape of any contents, and such vehicle must pass the inspection of the Burgess and meet his approval. The work of collecting shall be done in a clean and sanitary manner.

Section 5. The charge for collecting garbage and rubbish shall be reasonable, and each person served shall provide a tightly covered garbage can conveniently placed for the garbage collector.

Section 6. If the person appointed under the provisions of Section 3 shall not conduct the removal of garbage in a manner satisfactory to the Council, Council reserves the right to rescind his appointment at any time within the period for which the privilege shall be granted.

Section 7. Any person, other than the person appointed by Council, collecting garbage and rubbish within the Borough limits during the period designated by Council, shall upon conviction be subject to a fine or penalty of Five (\$5.00) Dollars for each day's violation.

Section 8. Any person violating Section 1 or Section 2 shall forfeit and pay for each offense the sum of not less than Two (\$2.00) Dollars nor more than Twenty (\$20.00) Dollars.
