

ORDINANCE NO. 102

An Ordinance authorizing the grading, paving and draining of Hancock Street between Second and Sixth Streets, Third Street from Morris to Hancock Streets, Fourth Street from Morris to Hancock Streets and Fifth Street from Morris to Hancock Streets; providing for the collection from owners of abutting real estate their share of the costs; declaring certain obstacles to be nuisances; and empowering the Borough Engineer to assess costs on property owners.

WHEREAS, notices were given according to law, June 21 1948, by more than ten hand bills posted on the lines of the proposed improvement that an ordinance authorizing said improvement would be presented to Council, July 12, 1948.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Clymer, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:

Section 1. That Hancock Street between Second and Sixth Streets, Third Street from Morris to Hancock Streets, Fourth Street from Morris to Hancock Streets and Fifth Street from Morris to Hancock Streets, be paved to a maximum width of twenty (20) feet with a heavy surface treatment of oil and limestone chips, according to plans and specifications promulgated by the Borough Engineer.

Section 2. That the proper officials be and they are hereby authorized to enter into contracts in the name of the Borough of Clymer for the necessary material and equipment to be used in the said improvement, after receiving best bids on material, etc; and the Borough Engineer is hereby designated as the person in charge of said work with full power to act for the Borough and contracts thereunder, and also to estimate assessments, costs and expenses of said improvement.

Section 3. That any trees, pipes, poles or other things interfering with the free and full construction of said work and the making of said improvement are hereby declared nuisances and may be removed or changed by the Borough in case the owners or companies having such trees, pipes, poles, etc. fail to remove same, and the expense thereof charged to said owners.

Section 4. That the said grading, paving and draining, the cost and expense of same be, done, paid for, assessed and collected in accordance with the Act of Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, approved May 4, 1927, P. L. 519, known as "The General Borough Act", amendments thereof and supplements thereto, said Act empowering the Boroughs of this Commonwealth, without petition of property owners to grade, pave and drain and otherwise improve public streets or parts thereof and assess a portion of the cost thereof on the owners of property abutting thereon, and providing for collection of the same.

RESOLUTION

Naming and designating certain streets and avenues in the Borough of Clymer.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough of Clymer that the following streets and avenues be named and designated as hereinafter set forth and that the official borough map be changed in accordance therewith.

1. Chestnut Avenue - running parallel with and between Williams Street and Walcott Street from First and Third Streets.
2. Hemlock Avenue - running parallel to First Street and between the said First Street and Twolick Creek from Williams Street to Walnut Avenue.
3. Walnut Avenue - running parallel to and between Walcott Street and Hancock Street from Hemlock Avenue to Fourth Street and from Fifth Street to Spruce Street.
4. Maple Avenue - running parallel with and between Hancock Street and Morris Street from Twolick Creek to Fourth Street and from Cypress Avenue to Bayberry Avenue.
5. Oak Avenue - running parallel with and between Morris Street and Franklin Street from Twolick Creek to Elm Avenue.
6. Beech Avenue - running parallel with and between Franklin Street and Sherman Street from Twolick Creek to Fifth Street and from Larch Avenue to Eighth Street.
7. Mill Avenue - running parallel with Adam Street and between said Adam Street and the Cherry Tree and Dixonville Railroad from Fifth Street to Sixth Street.
8. Fir Avenue - running parallel with and between Sixth Street and Plum Avenue from Adam Street to Mill Avenue.
9. Plum Avenue - running parallel with and between Fir Avenue and Fifth Street from Adam Street to Mill Avenue.

10. Peach Avenue - running parallel with and between First Street and Ebony Avenue from Walcott Street to Franklin Street.
  11. Ebony Avenue - running parallel with and between Peach Avenue and Second Street from Walcott Street to Franklin Street.
  12. Cedar Avenue - running parallel with and between Second Street and Birch Avenue from Chestnut Avenue to Franklin Street.
  13. Birch Avenue - running parallel with and between Cedar Avenue and Third Street from Walcott Street to Franklin Street.
  14. Tulip Avenue - running parallel with and between Third Street and Pine Avenue from Walcott Street to Sherman Street.
  15. Pine Avenue - running parallel with and between Tulip Avenue and Fourth Street from Walcott Street to Sherman Street.
  16. Lombardi Avenue - running parallel with and between Fourth Street and Cypress Avenue from Morris Street to Franklin Street.
  17. Cypress Avenue - running parallel with and between Lombardi Avenue and Fifth Street from Maple Avenue to Franklin Street.
  18. Larch Avenue - running parallel with and between Fifth Street and Cherry Avenue from Walnut Avenue to Beech Avenue.
  19. Cherry Avenue - running parallel with and between Larch Avenue and Sixth Street from Walcott Street to Beech Avenue.
  20. Spruce Avenue - running parallel with and between Sixth Street and Poplar Avenue from Maple Avenue to Beech Avenue.
  21. Poplar Avenue - running parallel with and between Spruce Avenue and Seventh Street from Morris Street to Beech Avenue.

22. Elm Avenue - running parallel with and between Seventh Street and Bayberry Avenue from Morris Street to Beech Avenue.

23. Bayberry Avenue - running parallel with and between Elm Avenue and Eighth Street from Maple Avenue to Beech Avenue.

24. Laurel Avenue- running parallel with Sage Street and to the Northwest of said Sage Street from Thorn Avenue to Stockton Street.

25. Thorn Avenue - running parallel to Stockton Street and to the Northeast of said Stockton Street from Crabtree Avenue to Laurel Avenue.

26. Crabtree Avenue - running parallel with Sage Street and to the Southeast of said Sage Street from Thorn Avenue to Stockton Street.

27. Railroad Avenue - beginning at the intersection of Jefferson Street and the Borough Line; thence in a Northerly direction 50 feet, more or less, and thence by line parallel to Jefferson Street 1300 feet, more or less, to a point and thence in a Southerly direction 50 feet, more or less, to a point on Jefferson Street.

28. Dixon Road - running parallel with Penn Street and to the Northwest of said Penn Street from the intersection of Sixth Street and Dixon Road to Gerry Street.

29. Spring Avenue - running parallel with Gerry Street and to the south of said Gerry Street from Juniper Avenue to Dixon Road.

30. Juniper Avenue - running parallel with and between Lee Street and Penn Street from Spring Avenue to Wilson Street Extension.

31. Hickory Avenue - running parallel with and between Dixon Road and Sage Street from Stockton Street to Rush Street.

32. Elder Avenue - beginning at a point on Dixon Road, said point being approximately 150 feet Northeast of Lot No. 234; thence running in a Southwesterly direction on a course parallel to Dixon Road approximately 1120 feet.

33. Willow Avenue - running parallel with and to the South and Southeast of Dixon Road from the Borough Line to Stockton Street.

34. Ash Avenue - running perpendicular from Hines Street to Dixon Road.

## RESOLUTION

RESOLVED by the Borough of Clymer, Indiana County, Pennsylvania, at a meeting of the said Borough Council held the 18th day of January, 1949, that a meeting of the said Council be held on the 15th day of February, 1949, at 8:00 o'clock, P.M., in the Municipal Building of the said Borough for the purpose of adopting an ordinance levying a per capita tax of FIVE DOLLARS (\$5.00) on each person residing in the Borough of Clymer of the age of 21 years and upwards; said tax to be effective thirty (30) days from the date of the adoption of said ordinance.
