

ORDINANCE NO. 12

An Ordinance making regulations relative to location of stables; accumulations of manure, compost and the like in barns, stables, stable yards, hog pens and other places and prescribing the location and manner of in which the pig pens shall be built and manure and filth removed therefrom; also fixing penalty for violation of this ordinance.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer in the County of Indiana and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. No person or persons shall keep, pile or accumulate manure, compost or the like within forty feet of any inhabited dwelling house in the Borough, or within twenty-five feet of any street opened to travel; any person violating this section shall be subject to a fine or penalty of not less than two nor more than ten dollars, and additional fine or penalty of two dollars for each and every day the same be allowed to remain.

Section 2. The keeper or keepers of a livery or hotel stable shall keep his or their stable and stable-yard clean, and shall not permit, between the 15th day of May and the 1st day of November, more than four two-horse wagon loads of manure to accumulate in or near the same at any one time, except by express permission of the Board of Health.

Section 3. Between the 15th day of May and the 1st day of November, not more than two wagon loads of manure shall be permitted to accumulate at any one time, in or near any private stable.

Section 4. Manure shall be removed and hauled only in a tight vehicle, so protected that no portion shall be dropped or left in any street or alley of the Borough.

Section 5. No pig pen shall be built or maintained within the limits of the Borough without a permit from the Board of Health or within seventy-five feet of any inhabited house, well or spring of water used for cooling or drinking purposes or within forty feet of any street, and all such pens shall have a floor of boards or planks from the ground in order that the filty accumulating under the same may be easily removed at least once a week, or oftener, if so ordered by the Board of Health or Health officer.

Section 6. Any person, firm, or body corporate violating any of the sections of this ordinance, the penalty for which has not been specially provided, shall pay a fine or penalty of not less than five, nor more than twenty dollars, and all costs.

Section 7. Upon judgment against any person by summary conviction of violation of any section of this ordinance, or by proceedings by summons, on default of payment of fine or penalty imposed by said judgment and the costs, the defendant shall be sentenced and committed to the County jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

Ordained and enacted by the Town Council lawfully assembled in the Borough, this 20th day of July, 1908.
