

ORDINANCE NO. 125

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE PROHIBITION OF THE DRIVING OF VEHICLES OF A WEIGHT OF SEVEN AND ONE-HALF ($7\frac{1}{2}$) TONS, WITH OR WITHOUT LOAD, OVER BLACK-TOP PAVED, BRICK OR UNPAVED STREETS OF THE BOROUGH OF CLYMER.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Borough of Clymer, Indiana County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same as follows;

SECTION 1. That in order to prevent damage to the black-top paved, brick, or unpaved streets of the Borough of Clymer and in the interest of public safety, motor vehicles of a weight of seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) tons, with or without load, shall, after the date this ordinance becomes effective, be prohibited from the use of said black-top paved, brick, or unpaved streets subject to the hereinafter set out provisions.

SECTION 2. That the prohibitive provision of this ordinance does not apply to the use of said streets by vehicles in the normal and or usual course of business deliveries to or from places of business or residences situate in the Borough of Clymer.

SECTION 3. That the prohibitions and limitations of this ordinance shall be posted at the streets to which they are to apply.

SECTION 4. That any vehicle loaded in excess of the specified weight limitations travelling over said posted streets may be stopped by a peace officer in uniform and said peace officer may under said vehicle from the street or may order the excessive load removed before the vehicle will be permitted to proceed on said street.

SECTION 5. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon summary conviction before the Burgess or a Justice of the Peace of said borough be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars and costs of prosecution, and in default of the payment thereof, shall undergo imprisonment of not more than five (5) days.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and due publication.
