

ORDINANCE NO. 127

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING THE OFFENSE OF DISORDERLY CONDUCT AND FIXING PENALTIES FOR COMMISSION OF SUCH OFFENSE.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, County of Indiana, and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:

SECTION 1. Any person or persons who by any act, word or conduct cause or tend to cause a disturbance of the peace and good order of the Borough, or cause or tend to cause any danger, discomfort or annoyance to the inhabitants of the borough or users of the borough thoroughfares, or any person or persons who shall by loafing, fighting, drunkenness, vagrancy, begging, the making of unnecessary noises, the use of profanity or indecent language or the reckless or careless driving or any other use of vehicles so as to endanger the safety, or interfere with the comfort and convenience of persons using or residing nearby the thoroughfares of the borough shall be guilty of the offense of disorderly conduct.

SECTION 2. Any person or persons who shall be found guilty of the offense of disorderly conduct shall upon conviction thereof be sentenced to pay a fine or penalty not exceeding \$100.00 dollars and costs, and in default of payment thereof, shall be imprisoned for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days.

SECTION 3. All ordinances, laws or regulations inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed; all rights, however, of the borough accruing in anyway under ordinances repealed are specifically reserved.
