

ORDINANCE NO. 14

An Ordinance prescribing the kind of buildings to be used for packing and storing of hay and straw for commercial purposes and fixing the place where it must be done; prohibiting the accumulation of straw outside of such buildings; prescribing other safeguards; fixing penalties for violation of this ordinance.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, in the County of Indiana and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. That from and after the passage, publication and recording of this ordinance, all buildings used for packing or storing hay and straw, or either of them, for commercial purposes, shall be constructed as follows: They shall be covered with non-combustible roofing, the sides shall be weather-boarded or boarded and closely stripped; all openings shall be provided with doors and kept securely closed and locked except when the owner or his employees shall be engaged in receiving, packing, handling or shipping hay or straw. Any person packing or storing hay or straw for commercial purposes in a building that does not comply with the requirements of this section, shall be subject to a penalty of twenty-five dollars for each and every day he shall use such building.

Section 2. All hay or straw, or either of them, shall be packed within a building having the requirements provided by Section One of this ordinance; no hay or straw shall be allowed to accumulate outside of such building, but shall be gathered up and removed every evening; no artificial light shall be allowed in or about buildings used for packing or storing hay or straw, or either of them, for commercial purposes, except electric light properly insulated. Any person violating any provision of this section, shall be subjected to a penalty of twenty-five dollars.

Section 3. Upon judgment against any person by summary conviction of violation of any section of this ordinance, or by proceedings by summons, on default of payment of fine or penalty imposed by said judgment and costs, the defendant shall be sentenced and committed to the County Jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

Section 4. The Chief of Police, any subordinate policeman or High Constable shall be permitted to inspect all buildings used under Sections One and Two, the contents thereof and surroundings, at any time, and shall make complaint to the Chief Burgess of any violation of this ordinance.
