

ORDINANCE No. 162

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON CERTAIN STREETS IN THE BOROUGH OF CLYMER AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Clymer, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle on Franklin Street from First Street to Ninth Street and on Sixth Street from Franklin Street to Penn Street and on Penn Street from the intersection of Sixth Street and Penn Street to Wilson Street, between the hours of 2:00 o'clock, A. M., and 6:00 o'clock, A. M., from the first day of December to the first day of April of each year, and it shall further be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle on the aforesaid streets between 4:00 o'clock, A. M.; and 6:00 o'clock, A. M., from April 1 to December 1 of each year.

SECTION 2. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction before the Mayor or Justice of the Peace, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than One (\$1.00) Dollar nor more than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, together with costs of prosecution, and in default thereof shall undergo imprisonment in the County Jail for a period not to exceed ten (10) days.

SECTION 3. Any ordinance or part of ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as the provisions affect this ordinance.
