

ORDINANCE NO. 165

LAYING OUT, OPENING AND ADOPTING AS A PUBLIC ALLEY IN THE BOROUGH OF CLYMER AN ALLEY TO BE DESIGNATED AS UNNAMED ALLEY AND FIXING AND REGULATING THE WIDTH AND GRADE THEREOF.

SECTION 1; BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that the following alley, which is hereby designated as unnamed Alley, is hereby laid out, opened and ordained as a public alley in the Borough of Clymer, which is more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the northern line of Dixon Road at corner common to Lot No. 254 on Dixon Road; thence by the line of Lot No. 254 North $11^{\circ} 05'$ West 68 feet to a point. Thence North $78^{\circ} 55'$ East 16 feet to the Western line of Lot No. 252; thence by the Western line of Lot No. 252 South $11^{\circ} 05'$ East 68 feet to a point on the northern line of Dixon Road; thence by the northern line of Dixon Road South $78^{\circ} 55'$ West 16 feet to the place of beginning.

SECTION 2; That the grade of said alley beginning at the intersection of said alley with Dixon Road and proceeding in a northerly direction for sixty-eight (68) feet shall be a rising grade of ten per centum. The grade as aforesaid shall be for the center line of said alley.

SECTION 3; The said alley shall consist of a central roadway for vehicular traffic sixteen (16) feet in width.

SECTION 4; That the Borough Manager is hereby directed to change the adopted Borough Map as herein indicated.

SECTION 5: That any Ordinance or part of Ordinance conflicting with this Ordinance is hereby repealed.

RESOLUTION

RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Borough of Clymer be and he is hereby authorized to issue "holding tank" permits to any applicant to install a holding tank within the Borough under Title 25. Rules and Regulations, Part I. Department of Environmental Resources, Chapters 71 and 73.

The applicant shall, at its expense, clean the holding tank under the direction and supervision of the Street Commissioner of the Borough and in the event the applicant fails to properly maintain the holding tank, then the Street Commissioner shall see to it that the holding tanks are properly cleaned and the Borough shall bill the applicant for the cost of such services.
