

ORDINANCE NO. 20

An Ordinance prohibiting the trial or service of mares within the Borough and providing a penalty therefore.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, in the County of Indiana, and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. No stallion or jack shall be permitted by any owner, employee or other person to try or serve any mare within the limits of the Borough; and any person owning or having charge of any such stallion or jack, violating the provisions of this ordinance, shall pay a fine or penalty of not less than five, nor more than ten dollars and costs for each and every violation, and upon judgment against any person by summary conviction of violation of this ordinance, or by proceedings by summons, on default of payment of fine or penalty imposed by said judgment and the costs, the defendant shall be sentenced to the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.
