ORDINANCE NO. 22

An Ordinance regulating hawking and peddling on the streets of the Borough, requiring licenses therefore to be taken out and prescribing penalty for violation of this ordinance.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, in the County of Indiana and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. It shall not be lawful for any person to occupy any part of street or public thoroughfare of the Borough, with or without a stand, buggy, wagon or other vehicle, for the purpose of vending or distributing any medicine, jewelry, soap, whips, balloons, or other articles of merchandise whatever, without first paying to the Chief Burgess of said Borough the sum of five dollars license fee for each and every day and fraction of a day and obtaining a license.

Section 2. Any person violating this ordinance shall pay a fine or penalty of ten dollars for each and every violation, and all costs, and upon judgment against any person by summary conviction of violation of this ordinance, or by proceedings by summons, on default of payment of fine or penalty imposed by said judgment and the costs, the defendant shall be sentenced and committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

Ordained and enacted by the Town Council lawfully assembled in said Borough, this 20th day of July, 1908.
