

ORDINANCE NO. 23

An Ordinance regulating and licensing persons or firms engaged in business of auctioneering goods, ware and merchandise of whatever kind within the Borough fixing the amount to be paid by the same, and prescribing a penalty for violation of ordinance.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, in the County of Indiana and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. No person or persons, firm or firms shall engage in the business of auctioneering, or attempt to sell at public auction or out-cry within the Borough of Clymer, any goods, wares, or merchandise whatever without first having paid to the Chief Burgess a license fee of two hundred dollars and obtained from the Chief Burgess a license permitting him or them to carry on said business of auctioneering, which said license shall be for one year from the date of issue and no longer; Provided: The above shall not apply to persons and firms regularly engaged in business in the Borough for the space of three months, who wish to reduce or close out their stock, nor to any auctioneer they may employ for said purpose.

Section 2. Any person or persons, firm or firms violating the provisions of the foregoing section, shall pay a fine or penalty of fifty dollars for each and every violation, all costs, and upon judgment against any person by summary conviction of violation of this ordinance, or by proceedings by summons, on default of payment of fine or penalty imposed by said judgment and the costs, the defendant shall be sentenced and committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

Ordained and enacted by the Town Council lawfully assembled in said Borough this 20th day of July, 1908.
