

ORDINANCE NO. 24

An Ordinance requiring transient retailers to take out a license, fixing the amount of such penalty for failure to procure such license.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, in the County of Indiana and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. That every person, whether principal or agent, not engaged in permanent business in the Borough of Clymer, but entering into, beginning or desiring to begin a transient or retail business therein, for the sale of any goods, wares or merchandise whatsoever, whether the same shall be represented or held forth to be bankrupt, assignee, or about to quit business or of goods damaged by fire, water or otherwise, or by an attractive or conspicuous advertisement whatsoever, shall take out a license for the same from the Chief Burgess of said Borough.

Section 2. The amount of such license shall be One Hundred and Fifty Dollars per month; said license to be renewed monthly during the continuance of such sales.

Section 3. Upon failure to said person or persons so to secure license, he or they shall be fined in the sum of One Hundred Dollars, and upon judgment against any person by summary conviction of violation of this ordinance, or by proceedings by summons, on default of payment of fine or penalty imposed by said judgment and the costs, the defendant shall be sentenced and committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.
