

ORDINANCE NO. 25

An Ordinance licensing exhibitions, concerts, shows, dramatic exhibitions, merry-go-rounds and shooting galleries, and fixing the prices of such licenses; prohibiting tricks, devices and games of skill or chance for which money or other reward is in any manner demanded, wagered or received; prescribing penalties for violation of this ordinance.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, in the County of Indiana and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. No person or persons shall hold within the Borough, any theatrical exhibition, concert, circus, show or dramatic entertainment, play or performance, circus riding or feats of horsemanship, menagerie or exhibition of animals, natural curiosity, tricks of legerdemain or any other exhibition, entertainment or show or amusement of whatever name or nature, for which money or other reward is in any manner demanded or received, without a license for that purpose first had and obtained from the Burgess, which said license or permit shall express for what is granted and the time it is to continue. The price of such license shall not be less than three dollars per day nor more than twenty-five dollars per day, to be fixed by the Burgess when said license is issued.

Section 2. That for lectures on scientific or literary subjects, exhibition, festivals, fairs, and for musical parties or concerts, no license or permit shall be required.

Section 3. No person or persons shall set up or operate any merry-go-round, within the limits of the Borough, without having first obtained a license for that purpose from the Chief Burgess; the price of such license shall be one dollar per day.

Section 4. No person shall set up, conduct or operate a shooting gallery within the limits of the Borough, without a license for that purpose first had and obtained from the Chief Burgess; and the price of such license shall be the sum of fifty cents per day, for each and every day the same may be operated.

Section 5. No person shall use, employ, practice or perform any trick, device or game of skill or chance in said Borough, for which money or other reward is in any manner demanded, wagered or received.

Section 6. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall pay a fine or penalty of not less than five dollars, nor more than fifty dollars. Upon judgment against any person by summary conviction of violation of this ordinance, or by proceedings by summons, on default of payment of fine or penalty imposed by said judgment, and the costs, the defendant shall be sentenced and committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

Section 7. Owners of opera houses, or buildings erected for exhibitions, may make special contracts with the Town Council for licenses by the year for exhibitions and other entertainments in their respective buildings.
