

ORDINANCE NO. 29

An Ordinance adopting names for the streets of said Borough, and providing for the numbering of the houses and buildings thereon.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, in the County of Indiana, and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. The names of all streets laid out and designated on the original plot or plan of said Borough, and as shown by the plan prepared by the Borough Engineer, are hereby adopted as the names of said streets.

Section 2. Twenty-five feet shall be allowed for each number exclusive of streets and alleys.

Section 3. The lots on streets running in an easterly direction and westerly direction shall be numbered from the east toward the west, beginning with the westerly line of First Street, or the extension thereof, and numbered consecutively therefrom; provided, however, that each square shall begin with the even hundred, corresponding with the number of the street on the easterly side of the square, the odd numbers shall be on the southerly side of the streets and the even numbers on the northerly side.

Section 4. The lots on streets running in a northerly and southerly direction and intersecting Franklin Street, shall be numbered from said Franklin Street; the portion of said streets north of Franklin Street shall be known as North, and the portion thereof south of Franklin Street shall be known as South. Numbers shall begin at Franklin Street and every square north and south thereof shall begin with the even hundred, the first hundred being one square from Franklin Street. The odd numbers shall be on the westerly side of the Streets and the even numbers on the easterly side.

Section 5. It is hereby expressly provided that Sections 3 and 4 of this ordinance shall only apply to that portion of the Borough which is south of the right of way of the Cherrytree and Dixonville Railroad Co., as now laid out, no system of numbering being provided for that portion of the Borough north of said Railroad right of way.
