

ORDINANCE NO. 301

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF CLYMER, COUNTY OF INDIANA AND COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA TO ESTABLISH FOURTH STREET AS A ONE-WAY ROADWAY

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Clymer, and it is hereby ordained and enacted as follows:

SECTION 1. ONE-WAY ROADWAY ESTABLISHED.

Pursuant to the provisions of 75 Pa. C.S. Section 3308 and 6109(a)(4) relating to one-way roadways, that from and after the effective date of this Ordinance, the following is hereby established as a one-way roadway:

Roadway	From	To	Direction of Travel
Fourth Street	Franklin Street	Beech Avenue	North

SECTION 2. PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS.

Any person who shall operate a vehicle upon the roadway or portion thereof hereby established as a one-way roadway other than in the direction hereby established for traffic thereon shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine, which fine shall be set consistent with the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania.

SECTION 3. The Clymer Borough Council shall erect and install, or cause to be erected and installed, an official sign bearing the words: **"One Way"**. The said sign shall be installed on the entrance to Fourth Street.

SECTION 4. All Ordinances, Resolutions or parts of Ordinances or Resolutions inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they conflict with this Ordinance.

**Resolution
Operating Procedures**

Let it be known that Clymer Borough Council adopts the following procedures for operation of Council Meetings. Council hereby officially adopts Robert's Rules of Order for conducting business unless it is in direct violation of the Borough Code or any other applicable regulations.

Individuals that will be speaking must give notice of their name and state the issue that they will be discussing. Those wishing to speak, audience and council members alike, must address the chair and be recognized prior to speaking. Where several residents wish to speak on the same subject, a spokesperson will be appointed. A five-minute time limit will be set aside for each individual to address the subject that they wish to bring before the members. No loud outbursts will be tolerated. Speakers will not enter into a discussion among audience or other members of council but will address the chairperson only. Only one person will be recognized at a time and only one person will speak at a time. Issues that are unresolved will be referred to committee. Issues that have been addressed will not be revisited throughout the meeting. Council will adhere to a very formal meeting for their monthly council meeting but will be less stringent during the committee meetings.
