

ORDINANCE NO. 31

An Ordinance granting the Central District and Printing Telegraph Company, of Pennsylvania, its successors, lessees and assigns, the right to construct, operate and maintain poles, wires, cables, and fixtures together with the necessary supports upon, over, along, and under the streets, highways, foot-walks, lanes and alleys of the Borough of Clymer, Indiana County, Pennsylvania, on the conditions hereinafter provided.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, in the County of Indiana, and the State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the name.

Section 1. That the privilege be and is hereby granted to the Central District and Printing Telegraph Company, its successors, lessees and assigns, to construct, operate and maintain the necessary poles, wires, cables and fixtures together with the necessary supports upon, over, along and under the streets, highway, foot-walks, lanes and alleys of the said Borough as be necessary for the purpose of constructing, operating, and maintaining lines of telegraph and telephone through the said Borough and to the places of business, works, manufacturing establishments, offices and houses of subscribers within the Borough limits and adjacent thereto, subject to the conditions and regulations hereinafter contained.

Section 2. That the said Central District and Printing Telegraph Company shall replace the streets, highways, foot-walks, lands and alleys of the said Borough, upon which it shall erect any of its poles or fixtures as aforesaid, in as good condition as they were before said poles and fixtures were erected thereon; and further, that all poles and fixtures as aforesaid shall be made under the direction and supervision of the Street Committee of the Council of the Borough aforesaid.

Section 3. That all poles erected under the provisions of this ordinance shall be reasonably straight, planted not less than five (5) feet in the ground, and shall be kept well painted by the said Company; and there shall be no cross arms for suppression of wires and cables placed at a less distance than twenty (20) feet from the grade of the street, unless by permission of the said Council.

Section 4. The said Central District and Printing Telegraph Company shall be governed by all legal ordinances of a general nature now enforced or that may hereafter be enforced.

Section 5. This grant is given upon the condition that the said Borough shall have the right and privileges to place the wires of its fire alarm and police telegraph system upon all the poles of said Company within the limits of said Borough, free of charge, provided, however, that such privilege shall not be so exercised as to interfere with the proper use of said poles by said Company. And the privileges granted to the said Borough under this section shall not be transferred or sub-let except with the permission of said Central District and Printing Telegraph Company. All such placing of wires shall be done under the supervision of and to the satisfaction of said Company.

Section 6. The said Company, within thirty days after the passage and approval of this ordinance, file with the secretary of Council its certificate of acceptance of all the terms, conditions and provisions of this ordinance. The said Company shall pay the expenses incident to the passage and publication of this ordinance.

Section 7. That any ordinance or part of ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed so far as the same affects this ordinance.
