

ORDINANCE NO. 45

An Ordinance for the admission into the Borough of Clymer, County of Indiana, and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, of a certain section of land lying adjacent into the easterly boundary line of said Borough, and plotted into lots to conform with the Borough plan.

Whereas, the Dixon Run Land Company is the sole owner of a certain tract of land or section lying adjacent to the Borough of Clymer along its easterly line, which has been plotted into lots so as to conform with the general plot or plan of said Borough; and

Whereas, said Dixon Run Land Company has erected a large number of dwelling houses on said tract of land, being about forty in number, and

Whereas, said Dixon Run Land Company has presented unto the Town Council and Burgess of said Borough of Clymer a petition praying for the admission of said tract of land or section into said Borough.

Now, therefore, be it enacted, and it is hereby enacted by and with the authority of the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, County of Indiana and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as follows:

Section 1. That all that certain tract of land or section lying adjacent to the Borough of Clymer along the easterly line thereof, and more particularly bounded and described as follows, viz:

Beginning at a post where the same corners on lands of J.W. Ackerson in the easterly line of the Borough of Clymer, thence along the line of said Borough of Clymer, N. 11 degrees 54 minutes E. 1646.67 feet to the extremity of said Borough line where the same terminates at corner of lands of Mrs. Jennie Oligher and the lands of the Pioneer Coal Company.

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formerly the Farmers Bank of Indiana, Pa., in the Middle of Two Lick Creek; thence up said creek separating from said lands of the Pioneer Coal Company S. 65 degrees 10' E. 187.9 feet; thence by same S. 49 degrees 10' E. 438 feet to the corner of lands of the Clymer Brick and Fire Clay Company; thence along said lands of the Clymer Brick and Fire Clay Company, S. 5 degrees 54' E. 370.5 feet corner in the Southern line of a 16 foot alley; thence along said Southern line of said alley separating from said lands of the Clymer Brick and Fire Clay Co., S. 84 degrees 6' W. 110.7 feet to post; thence along same S. 39 degrees 45' W. 110.7 feet to post at corner in line of the lands of J.S. Ackerson; and thence along said lands of J.W. Ackerson S. 85 degrees 50' E. 50 feet to post in the Borough line at the place of beginning, containing Fourteen and Five-Tenths acres, be and the same is hereby admitted to the Borough of Clymer, and shall forever hereafter be deemed, taken and allowed to be a part of said Borough, and subject to the jurisdiction and government of the municipal authorities thereof, as fully as if the same had been originally a part of said Borough.

Section 2. That a plot or plan of the tract of land or section hereby admitted to the Borough shall be filed in the office of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the County of Indiana, and notice thereof shall be published in the Indiana Progress and Marion Center Independent, two weekly newspapers of general circulation published in said County of Indiana.

Section 3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances not in accord with this ordinance are hereby repealed in so far as the same are not in accordance herewith.
