

An ordinance vacating a certain portion of the East side of Dixon Road in the Borough of Clymer, beginning at the North side of Wilson Street and extending northwardly to the Borough line and widening said Dixon Road on the West side thereof from the north line of said Wilson Street northward to the Borough line.

Whereas, the Dixon Run Land Company, being the sole owner of all abutting properties has petitioned Town Council to vacate a certain portion of the East side of Dixon Road and widen the West side thereof. Hereinafter fully described expressly waiving all claim for damages by reason of said improvement. Therefore be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer, County of Indiana and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. That all that part and portion of Dixon Road in said Borough bounded and described as follows: beginning at a point on the east side of Dixon Road at the corner of lot #4 Penn Street where same corners of Dixon Road thence south eighty degrees forty-five minutes west thirty-five feet to a corner thence by a line parallel with the original east line of Dixon Road north nine degrees fifteen minutes west eight-hundred seventy-nine feet more or less to the Intersection with Borough line in line with the Wm. Barnett tract thence by the Borough line along said Wm. Barnett tract north eight degrees thirty-seven minutes east one hundred twenty-five feet to corner of lot #74 Penn Street where the original east line of

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said Dixon Road south nine degrees fifteen minutes east nine hundred ninety feet more or less to the southwest corner of lot #40 Penn St. at place of beginning be and the same is hereby vacated. Provided however that there is expressly excepted and reserved from the operation hereof those certain portions of two sixteen foot alleys between lots #48 and 50 Penn Street which shall remain in open in their entire length through the entire length through the portion of Dixon Road hereby vacated.

Section 2. That the portion of Dixon Road extending from the north line of Wilson Street northward to the Borough line shall be and is hereby extended and widened by the addition and appropriation of that certain piece, parcel or strip of ground more particularly bounded and described as follows: beginning at a point where the original westerly line of Dixon Road intersects the relocated northerly line of Wilson Street being the southeast corner of lot #90 Dixon Road thence along line of said Wilson Street south eighty degrees forty-five minutes west twenty-five feet to corner in line of said lot #90 Dixon Road thence by a line parallel with the original westerly line of said Dixon Road, north nine degrees fifteen minutes west eight hundred four feet to the intersection with the Borough line in line of the William Barnett tract thence by the Borough line along the William Barnett tract north eight degrees thirty-seven minutes east eighty feet to the point where the original westerly line of said Dixon Road intersects the Borough line; thence along the original westerly line of said Dixon Road south nine degrees fifteen minutes east eight-hundred seventy-five feet more or less to the intersection with the northerly line of Wilson Street; as newly located at the place of beginning which said strip of ground is expressly appropriated and dedicated as a part and portion of said Dixon Road.

Section 3. That within ten days after approval of this ordinance notice shall be given by handbills posted along the line of the proposed improvement. At stating the fact and date of passage of this ordinance that the petition therefore was signed by a majority in interest and number of owners abutting and that any person interested and denying the fact that the petition was so signed may appeal to the Court of Common Pleas Court of Indiana County within thirty days after the passage thereof.

Section 4. That the map or general plans of the Borough be and is hereby changed, modified and amended in accordance with Section 2 of this ordinance.

Section 5. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
