

ORDINANCE NO. 61

An Ordinance authorizing the grading, draining, curbing and paving of Sixth Street from a point fifty feet south of Franklin Street, to the south side of Walcott Street, in the Borough of Clymer, Pa. and providing for the cost thereof.

Whereas, at a regular meeting of Town Council, February 2, 1925, it was curbing and paving of Sixth Street from directed that an ordinance authorizing the grading, draining, a point fifty feet south of Franklin Street the south side of Walcott Street, be prepared.

And whereas, notice was given February 16th, 1925, by ten hand bills posted on the line of the proposed improvement that an ordinance authorizing said improvement would be presented to Town Council for consideration and action at a regular meeting March 2, 1925, when and where objections there would be heard.

And whereas, no objections have been made to the proposed improvements; therefore, be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. That Sixth Street from a point fifty feet south of Franklin Street be graded, drained, curbed and paved according to plans and specifications to be prepared by the Borough Engineer, and under the supervision of the Engineer and Street Committee; two thirds of the cost and expense thereof to be collected from the owners of real estate abutting thereon by an equal assessment on the foot front to be made by the Borough Engineer.

Section 2. The Street Committee is hereby authorized to grade, drain, curb and pave said portions of said street, or advertise and receive bids and with approval of Council, enter into contract therefor according to bid plans and specifications.

The foregoing ordinance having been presented to Town Council at a regular meeting, March 2, 1925, and having been read, was upon motion, ordered to be published in the Indiana Evening Gazette once a week for two weeks and five copies thereof to be posted along the proposed improvement ten days before final passage.
