

ORDINANCE NO. 71

An Ordinance extending and opening Penn Street in the Borough of Clymer of the width of fifty feet, beginning at a new center line of 1037.10 feet north of the intersection of Sixth Street and Penn Street, thence in a northerly direction to the Borough line.

Whereas at a meeting of Town Council, March, 5, 1928, it was directed that an ordinance be prepared extending and opening Penn Street as herein indicated.

And whereas, notice of the contemplated improvement was given March, 1928, by ten hand bills posted on the line of the proposed improvement as required by law.

Therefore be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Clymer and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same.

Section 1. That Penn Street be extended and opened of the width of fifty feet beginning at a new center line of Penn Street, station 23-73.62, 1037.10 feet north of the intersection of Sixth Street and Penn Street, thence by said center line, N. 13.42, W. 717.75 feet to point of curve at station 30-91.37, thence along said new center line by a 6 degree curve to the right, a distance of 538.63 feet to the Borough line at station 36-30.0.

The foregoing ordinance having been presented to Town Council at a regular meeting, April 2, 1928, and having been read, was upon motion ordered to be published in the Indiana Evening Gazette once a week for three consecutive weeks.
